Food Waste Recycling is Coming!

The city of Carpinteria and E.J. Harrison & Sons will begin to roll out a residential food waste recycling program on Jan. 1, 2022, in compliance with California Senate Bill 1383, which takes effect that day.

SB 1383 requires communities to reduce organic waste disposal, including food waste, by 75%, by 2025.

Existing yard waste carts will be used to collect bagged food waste. Your collection day will not change.

Important: Please do not place food waste directly into the yard waste cart, as this will contaminate the yard waste. **All food waste should be bagged.** Please use your own plastic bag, and be sure to tie it. A clear bag is preferred (though not required). Reusing what you have is best, but bags are available at local retailers and online sales outlets.

To minimize the number of food waste bags you use, gather food waste throughout the week in a single bag or a lined pail in the kitchen or in a container outside. (For information on pail availability in Carpinteria, contact Erin Maker, the city's environmental program manager, at erinm@ci.carpinteria.ca.us or 805-880-3415.) Securely tie the bag and place it in your yard waste cart for weekly pickup.

Below is a list of what goes into the cart directly, what must be bagged before being put into the cart, and what NOT to put into the yard waste cart.

Acceptable "Organic Waste" Items - In Yard Waste Cart (loose)

- Grass
- Leaves
- Plants, flowers
- Small branches
- Scrap lumber (no treated wood waste)
- Yard trimmings
- All other yard waste
- Bagged food waste

Help After the Holidays

For Two Weeks After Christmas, You Can Double Your Trash

E.J. Harrison & Sons will pick up twice the usual amount of residential customers' trash, at no extra cost, for the two weeks after Christmas. **From Monday, Dec. 27, through Saturday, Jan. 8**, you can place extra trash in bags alongside your trash cart.


We'll also collect extra recyclables. Be sure to flatten all boxes and place them alongside your blue recycling cart.

Recycle Your Christmas Tree

We're once again providing Christmas tree disposal to our residential customers and giving Mother Earth the gift of returning your trees to her.

For two weeks after the holiday - **from Dec. 27 through Jan. 8** - simply remove ornaments, hooks, lights, tinsel, bows, nails and tree stand; cut the tree into 4-foot sections; and place them in your yard waste cart for regular pickup. Flocked trees are accepted.

We appreciate your help, and thanks as well to your local cities for taking part in this program and to our strategic partners at Agromin, who process the trees into vital mulch for farmlands, orchards and nurseries as well as home gardens.



When You Fill Up Your Carts and Put Them at the Curb for Pickup ...

PLEASE GET IT RIGHT

An urgent appeal to all Harrison customers: In choosing which cart to use, please make sure it's: recyclables ONLY in the blue cart; yard waste - and, starting in two weeks, food waste! - in the tan cart*; and trash ONLY in the green cart*.

We're now picking up all three carts weekly, giving you more room to recycle all that you can; we hope you're taking full advantage of that. Trash cart contents go unsorted to the landfill, so any recyclable items that end up in there will needlessly take up space, and organic waste will emit harmful methane gas that's contributing to climate change.

Historically, Harrison customers have done a remarkable job of recycling, but the need to recycle has never been greater and cannot be overstated. With strict new state mandates taking effect on Jan. 1 - when food waste recycling will be added to the organics mix - it is now an imperative.

Thank you once again for working with us toward a better future.

** In the coming years, based on statewide color coding laws, tan yard waste carts will change to green; and green trash carts will change to black.*

- Meat, poultry, seafood (bones and shells)
- Fruits, vegetables
- Pasta, rice, bread, grains
- Eggs, dairy
- Coffee grounds
- All other food waste

Unacceptable Items

- Trash
- Styrofoam, straws
- Recyclables (plastic, glass, metal)
- Food-soiled paper
- Oil, grease
- Chemicals, cleaning supplies
- Pet waste
- Dirt and rocks
