Everything You Need to Know About Food Waste Recycling

Harrison Industries would like to thank its residential customers for contributing to this year's successful launch of residential food waste recycling. The program began Jan. 3 to divert food waste from landfills and thereby reduce greenhouse gas emissions that contribute to climate change.

The effort has continued to evolve, thanks in part to your feedback. Harrison and its partners at Gold Coast Recycling and Agromin are now accepting food waste placed in folded-shut paper bags, in response to customers' initial concerns about the use of plastic bags only, and because of the early success of the food waste staying contained on its journey from yard waste cart to recycling facility.

Agromin and Limoneira also have received final approval to expand their organic waste recycling facility in the Santa Clara Valley to process food waste. The compost facility near Santa Paula is now a fully permitted commercial operation that can handle commercial and residential food waste.

All residents are now required by law to recycle their food waste, and we've made participation as simple as possible. What laws require food waste recycling?

California Senate Bill 1383, signed into law in

Waste Carts Coming in New Colors

If you're seeing trash carts in town that are black instead of the usual green and wondering what's up, credit California Senate Bill 1383.

The comprehensive law that calls for food waste recycling also mandates a statewide uniform color system for all residential waste carts. Understanding that the changes, if required immediately, would lead to a huge number of unusable carts, the law wisely gives trash haulers until 2036 for full implementation.

Harrison has developed an orderly delivery plan that begins with new developments and then will start with consolidated neighborhoods. You will be notified about delivery of new carts and receive full instructions explaining exactly what to do with each one.

Based on the SB 1383 rules:

- ◆ New **black** carts will replace the green ones most customers now use for trash.
- ◆ New **green** carts will replace the tan ones now used for yard and food waste.
- ◆ The **blue** recycle carts will remain blue.

The new generation of 32-, 64- and 96-gallon carts are slightly shorter than the ones they are replacing, but they are wider and heavier, which should make them more stable during strong winds.

2016, added food materials to the list of landscaping, agricultural and other green waste that should be recycled, effective Jan. 1, 2022. The goal is to cut by 75 percent the amount of organic waste ending up in landfills by 2025 (with the 2014 amount as the baseline), thereby reducing methane gas emissions from landfills.

What is food waste?

Food waste includes meat, bones, poultry, seafood, shells, peels, dairy, eggs, pasta, grains, coffee grounds, fruits, vegetables and other inedible and edible parts of cooked and uncooked food.

How do I separate my food waste?

You can collect your food waste in a paper or plastic bag or a small container lined with a bag. The best option is to reuse bags you already have, such as bread, produce and other grocery bags. When the bag is full, just secure it and put it in your tan yard waste cart.

Can I place my food waste directly in my yard waste container without bagging it?

No. All food waste must be bagged. Plastic bags should be tied off, and paper bags should be tightly

folded up, before being placed in your yard waste container. Food waste placed directly into the cart will contaminate the yard trimmings used to make compost and other products.

Can I place my food waste pail or bags directly at the curb for pickup?

No. The sealed bags must be placed in your yard waste cart. The program was designed based on lower cost of service and reduced environmental footprint. Adding a fourth cart dedicated to food waste would require a fourth truck route and additional drivers, meaning higher costs and additional truck emissions.

What if I have food waste but no other yard waste?

You can still put your food waste bags into your yard waste cart and take it to the curb. And remember that we are now picking up all three carts – yard, recycling and trash – every week.

What happens to the food waste after it's collected?

The bags of food waste are separated out at the Gold Coast Recycling and Transfer Station in Ventura and sent to Agromin for processing into organic fertilizer, animal food, compost or renewable energy.

We Have Dumpsters, Bins for Your Summer Projects

If you're planning a big remodeling job this summer or even just a household cleanup, remember that Harrison Industries can supply large roll-off dumpsters and bins for all residential and commercial needs.

Roll-off containers can be rented on a temporary basis and are available in a variety of sizes for different projects. That includes remodeling and other construction, special events, cleanups, disaster scenes, industrial sites, office complexes, recycle projects, demolition and agriculture.

- ◆ 3-yard bins, which are about 6 feet 9 inches by 3 feet 6 inches and 4 feet 3 inches tall, with a maximum weight capacity of 700 pounds. They are ideal for home, garage and yard cleanups and come with plastic lids and wheels.
- ◆ 10-yard bins, which are about 16 feet by 8 feet by 2 feet. They can be used for removing concrete, dirt, asphalt, sod and other heavy materials.
- ◆ 25-yard and 40-yard bins, which are about 22 by 8 by 4 feet, and 22 by 8 by 6 feet, respectively. They are intended for construction sites, roofing projects, land clearing, demolition, weed abatement, and residential furniture and appliances. The 10-, 25- and 40-yard bins all have a 10-ton weight capacity.

Skip the Rinse When Recycling

Despite some late-season rain, January and February were historically dry in California, leading us to an apparent third year of drought. Water conservation has become a necessity here, and one way you can help is to not waste water rinsing out your recyclables before putting them in your blue cart.

It is not necessary for you to rinse empty jars and other food containers before tossing them into your recycling cart. With advanced processing systems, E.J. Harrison & Sons and partner Gold Coast Recycling ask only that you empty containers of food. The rule is: "Empty but not rinsed."

And while you're at it, be sure to empty that food into a plastic or paper bag and then put those bags into your tan yard waste cart. It's part of our new food waste recycling program that began Jan. 3.

Do not, however, put your blue-cart recyclables into bags. They should be loose when tossed into your blue cart.

Materials that should be recycled include plastics 1-7, aluminum or metal, glass containers, paper and junk mail, newspapers and magazines, cartons, flattened cardboard, and cardboard food or shoe boxes.

Items not accepted include plastic bags and wrap, hoses, diapers, shredded paper and Styrofoam. For more recycling information, visit ejharrison.com and goldcoastrecycling.com.

CAMARILLO HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAM

Drop-off events take place the second consecutive Friday and Saturday of every month, by appointment only. For an appointment, call 805-987-0717 or online at cityofcamarillo.org/trashandrecycling (Hazardous Waste).

ACCEPTED ITEMS: Antifreeze, solvents, pesticides, household cleaners, pool & garden chemicals, household & car batteries, needles & lancets (in approved containers), fluorescent light tubes, cathode ray tubes (CRTs), compressed gas cylinders, fire extinguishers, oil based & latex paint, mercury-containing devices, motor oil & filters, and expired medication (no controlled substances). The legal transport limit for household hazardous waste is 15 gallons or 125 pounds.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED: Explosives, ammunition, fireworks, tires, radioactive waste, infectious waste and smoke alarms.
